<p><i>Fraxinus pennsylvanica</i> green ash</p>	<p>5-7</p>	 <p>(C) 2002, Gary Fewless</p>	<p>wing >1/2 way down</p> 	<p>Shorter petiolules, leaf scar a "bean"; most common, wide tolerances</p>
<p><i>Fraxinus nigra</i> black ash</p>	<p>7-11</p>	 <p>©2004 Gary Fewless</p>	<p>wing oblong, seed flat, near center</p>  <p>F. nigra</p>	<p>sessile leaflets, corky bark; wet areas, northern</p>
<p><i>Fraxinus quadrangulata</i> blue ash</p>	<p>7-11</p>	 <p>©2004 Gary Fewless</p>	<p>wing oblong, seed at base</p>  <p>Fewless</p>	<p>4-angled twigs; dry – mesic areas, Waukesha county</p>
